Code of Conduct

A couple of weeks ago I sent a message about this through the Age Co-ordinators, which I **produce** below. It is also on our App.

Unfortunately last Sunday my team witnessed some heated words between sideline parents which really distracted the boys during their warm up. To see the "ugly parent" from a teenager's perspective was a real eye opener. And it is indeed UGLY.

While we are in this relatively quiet period, please pass onto your teams the following:-

- The Code of Conduct is on the SJRU website
- Breaches can lead to major issues for the individual and the club. These can include: a citation, appearance at the judiciary, fines, loss of
 points and suspension AS WELL AS much time spent for the individual in dealing with the citation.
- The Club would like to add that any provocative comment made by anyone associated with the team (including parents) to anyone
 associated with the other team (including players/parents) is a breach of the Code of Conduct. Same applies to comments made to match
 officials.

So, some basic advice:-

- Think before you speak.
- One comment can lead to major issues as listed above.
- Remember we are at a teenage rugby match. It's about them.
- Don't make any negative comments to anyone. This includes opposition players and the ref.

- If another parent etc is acting aggressively towards you or someone around you, just walk away. If you want to take it further, contact the Ground Marshall at first instance.
- Applaud good play or sportsmanship no matter which team is involved.
